

Red wine List

Shiraz: Meerea Park Hunter Valley NSW Australia 2 (Bin 20) \$48 / \$12

The palate is proudly medium- bodied but does not lack in flavour with plenty of varietal red and dark berries. Fruit for this wine is from the Upper reaches of the Hunter Valley.

Cabernet Sauvignon Merlot: D'Arenberg SA 2014 (Bin 21) \$48 / \$12

A flavoursome, easy drinking style, ripe and juicy with lovely soft tannins and a savoury, earthy touch. Vibrant blend of iconic varieties and deeply layered with a textured feel.

Shiraz Cabernet Sauvignon: Spice Trader SA (Bin 22) \$54 / \$14

This is a very dark glass of juicy and delicious red. A burst of intense primary fruit greets the palate with blueberries, blackberries and currants.

Grenache: Turkey Flat South Australia 2017 (bin 23) \$89

The fruit for this wine was predominantly sourced from 98-year-old Grenache vines grown on the Turkey Flat Vineyard and is particularly well suited to the Barossa climate due to its ability to withstand extremes of heat, aridity and wind.

Grenache: Lloyd Brothers McLaren Vale 2014 (Bin 24) \$69

After being whole berry fermented for an extended maturation, the fruit was basket pressed and then seasoned in French oak. The wine displays freshly cut roses, hints of white and black top deck chocolate, roasted coffee beans, finishing with long lingering savoury tannins. A nice smooth Wine.

Shiraz: 11 Barrels Wild Ferment Shiraz 2016 Coonawarra SA (Bin 25) \$75

Vibrant and energetic, the mouth is coated generously by fruit. Super fine spices skirt the frame. Fine tannins, almost powdery, cap off a delicious Shiraz. A great find.

Shiraz: Two Sisters – Barossa South Australia 2014 (Bin 26) \$90

In the traditional style of the world-renowned Barossa Shiraz, this premium wine has a great depth of colour with deep garnet Red and Purple hues.

Syrah: Lloyd Brothers 2014 Bin (27) Adelaide Hills \$52

Harvested later in the season due to the altitude of the vineyard this wine was batch fermented in open fermenters before being put through a gentle press cycle. The wine is then seasoned in French and American oak for 12 months before being barrel selected for this delicate and elegant style.

Shiraz: Good Catholic Girl, Clare Valley, South Australia (Bin 28) \$85

Famed wine maker Jim Barry, passed away in 2004. Julie his Daughter, decided it was time for new challenges. She withdrew herself from Jim Barry Wines and headed over the hill to her **limerick** vineyard where she has come up with this limited release. A classic Armagh Shiraz, coming from dry grown Shiraz, it reflects all the characters of the soil that fed the Irish settlers 164 years ago, deep rich and smooth.... good enough to drink.

Reserve Tempranillo: Tim Addams South Australia 2009 (Bin 29) \$99

A lighter spicy dry red from the Clare valley. Exhibits the definitive Tempranillo characters of strawberry and cherry. In harmony with clove and cinnamon spice derived from 15 months in new and second use French oak.

Châteauneuf-du-Pape: Les Escondudes France (Bin 30) \$110

A wonderful Chateauneuf-du-Pape made from 100% Grenache, special for this type of wine. The name "**Escondudes**" comes from the Spanish word "Escondidas" (meaning hidden) in reference to the little hidden valley where the vineyard of **Domaine Les Escondudes** is situated

Pinot Noir: Howard Park Flint Rock Western Australia 2018 (Bin 31) \$70

This pretty Pinot Noir has a semi translucent appearance showing a deep cherry red colour wine offers fruity aromas of strawberries and ripe dark cherries Enhanced by spicy toasted oak and integrated with fine grained tannins, it makes way for a slightly dry delicate finish.

Shiraz Grenache Tempranillo Vinaceous Red Right Hand WA (Bin 32) \$65

It's entirely drinkable, approachable and has a great flavour. It's a blend of three grape varieties, so it manages to be both sweet and perfumed yet savoury all at once. It's a great food wine.

Pinot Noir Reserve Milton Tasmania 2015 (Bin 33) \$120

Only in exceptional years do Milton make their Family Reserve. This is the first Dunbabin Family Reserve – with 40% whole bunch in the pressings and longer selected barrel time. Smooth and savoury with rich plum and dark cherry fruit, soft spice and earthiness, a firm personality and soft seamless silkiness in the mouth with a density of flavours. Very seductive and sophisticated, best with food.

Meerlust Red: Stellenbosch South Africa 2013 (Bin 34) \$120

Quality “Bordeaux” blend from South Africa. Aromatic nose showing ripe black fruit, spices, chocolate and cigar box. When you need a good rich deep wine, this is the one. A little spicy which makes it very appealing.

Châteauneuf-du-Pape: Clos Saint Jean France 2015 (Bin 35) \$145

The 2015 Châteauneuf du Pape offers tons of black cherries, dried herbs, graphite and liquorice to go with sweet tannin, medium to full-bodied richness and no hard edges.

Flor De Pingus: Spanish Shiraz 2012 (Bin 36) \$200

Vivid ruby. Heady aromas of fresh blackberry, boysenberry and smoky minerals are complicated by pungent hints of vanilla, violet and allspice. Lush, intensely flavoured and focused, offering deep dark berry and cherry compote flavours and a suave spice cake nuance.

Zinfandel: Buckshot Vineyard Heathcote Victoria 2015 (Bin 37) \$65

Bold flavours of spicy black raspberries, liquorice and dark plum fill the juicy textured palate underscored by notions of blueberries and subtly earthed vanillin oak concluding with a burst of white pepper

Pinot Noir: Auntsfield New Zealand 2016 (Bin 38) \$85

Made and grown at Auntsfield Estate on the ancient Greywacke and Loess clay soils of the region. Dark cherry, blackberry, Plum and aromas of dark chocolate
